Route that runs along the **Sant Aniol** stream, from **Sadernes** to **Sant Aniol d'Aguja**. The route starts at the hermitage of **Santa Cecília**, goes towards the imposing limestone walls of **Sespasa Castle** and crosses the **Pont d'en Valentí** bridge to reach the hermitage of **Sant Aniol d'Aguja**. From here, we will discover **Salt de Ia Núvia**, from where there is a magnificent viewpoint looking over the **Sant Aniol valley**.



significant area of the Eastern Pre-Pyrenees. Among the most characteristic features are the cliffs and valley floors, which make up a landscape of great beauty and natural value.











We start the route in front of the hermitage of Santa Cecília, a 12th century Romanesque building that belongs to Sales de Llierca. It has a single nave with a semicircular apse, where the arrow loops are preserved. The original Espadanya bell tower was converted into a fortified tower, with a four-sided roof, with the aim of defending against possible attacks and theft.





Sespasa Castle

After the Pas dels Aures bridge, to the left of the Llierca river, rises the cliff on which are located the remains of what used to be a castle in the municipality of Sales de Llierca. This spectacular slab of calcareous rock has a high ecological interest for the nesting of different species of birds of prey.





We arrive at the Pont d'en Valentí bridge, built with limestone; it has two semi-circular arches made with very well-cut ashlar stones. The presence of this very important bridge tells us that, in the past, this was a highly populated area frequented by coal miners, woodcutters, porters and even smugglers.





Resclosa de Gomarell lock

We cross the Sant Aniol stream using the Pont d'en Valentí bridge and follow the path until we reach the Resclosa de Gomarell lock. This lock acts as a catchment point for drinking water for the municipalities of Montagut and Oix, Tortellà and Argelaguer. For this reason, it is forbidden to bathe there.





Hermitage of Sant Aniol d'Aguja

After crossing the stream by the suspension bridge of Clarioles, we arrive at the hermitage of Sant Aniol. Dating from the middle of the 12th century, it is one of the oldest churches in the Alta Garrotxa area. In the present day, it consists of a rectangular nave with a barrel vault and a two-sided roof, a semicircular apse and a small bell tower, where the Coralí bell





Salt de la Núvia (Bride's Leap)

Returning from Sant Aniol along the left bank, we arrive at Salt de la Núvia. Legend has it that they wanted to marry the daughter of the manor of Sant Aniol to the heir of the Talaixà blacksmith against her will. As they climbed the path that leads to Talaixà, she cried inconsolably. At the steepest bend in the cliff, to avoid the wedding, the girl let herself fall from her

is located. On the facade, we find a latticed rose window with a cross. Next to the hermitage, there is a fountain and the rectory, which is now in the process of being renovated. horse into the void. Despite this sad story, from this point on the mountain ledge, there is a magnificent view of the entire Sant Aniol valley.
